Help select board candidates

Next spring, members in Districts 5 and 6 will elect their board representative. Nominating committees are forming now.

Each committee will select a slate of at least two qualified candidates for GVEA's Board of Directors. There is a required three-hour training session in early December. Additionally, the committee usually meets three to four times between November and February at a convenient location selected by the committee members or virtually.

Nominating committee members are compensated \$60 per meeting attended, plus standard mileage rates for travel, should the committee decide to meet in person.
