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
Character of Service:

To be eligible for certification by the Association, a SNAP Project must meet the eligibility requirements in Section 6.18 of the Tariff. Eligible Members shall be hereinafter referred to as SNAP Producers. T
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SNAP Program Fees:

There are no additional fees required to participate in the SNAP Program. N,C
Members will be invoiced for monthly electric service and any other applicable non-SNAP related fees provided for in the Association Tariff. C

Payment to SNAP Producers:


Unless a SNAP Producer makes an election not to receive amounts under the SNAP Fund pursuant to Section 6.19, two types of payments will be made by the Association to each SNAP Producer. The payments to SNAP Producers and SNAP Plus Producers are an energy-related payment and a payment from the SNAP Fund, as follows:

(a) Association Purchases of Energy from SNAP Projects

The Association will make one (1) payment annually for energy produced from SNAP projects (Annual SNAP Payment). The Annual SNAP Payment will be made in April of the year following receipt of the generation (usually around Earth Day). The Association will also make an annual payment of the SNAP Producer's eligible proportion of the SNAP Fund.² (See Section 6.19). The price of energy purchased by the Association shall be priced using the Association's non-firm power rate set forth in Schedule QF-1 for the period covered by the Annual SNAP Payment.

L – Provisions that were addressed on Original Sheet No. 46 are now located on Sheet No. 46.1.

² The SNAP Fund component of the Annual SNAP Payment to the SNAP Producer shall be in proportion to the SNAP Producer's generation as a percentage of the total SNAP generation (in kilowatt-hours) received by the Association. Payments from the SNAP Fund shall be limited to a maximum of \$1.50 per kWh and subject to the availability of funds. The amounts in the SNAP Fund are dependent on voluntary contributions and purchases by Members. The Association makes no guarantee on amounts available from the SNAP Fund.

(b) Association Purchases of Energy from SNAP Plus Projects

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The Association will credit the SNAP Plus Producers monthly for energy received from the SNAP Plus Project after the SNAP Plus Producer's energy requirements are first served by the SNAP Plus Project.³ The price of energy purchased by the Association shall be priced at the Association's non-firm power rate set forth in Schedule QF-1. The Association will also make one (1) payment annually for energy produced from SNAP projects (Annual SNAP Payment). The Annual SNAP Payment will be made in April of the year following receipt of the generation (usually around Earth Day).

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³ The calculation of the payment or credit for a SNAP Plus Producer shall be made in accordance with 3 AAC 50.930(a) and (b).

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
